

# DISCOVERING WHAT WE BELIEVE: Week 8 | *DEVOTIONAL*

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## Day 1

### [Romans 8:28-30](#)

The journey of understanding what we believe begins with recognizing our calling through the Gospel. Romans 8 reminds us that God has a purpose for each of us, a preordained path leading to transformation. As we reflect on our identity as Christ followers, we must consider the implications of being called, justified, and glorified. This isn't merely an academic exercise; it's a lifestyle rooted in the conviction that we are designed for more than just existence—we are created for a relationship with God that empowers us to share His love with others.

As we engage with this text, ask yourself how your life reflects this calling. Are you living in the freedom of knowing you are justified and glorified? - Pray for clarity on your unique calling in Christ.
- Ask God to help you recognize opportunities to share your faith.

## Day 2

### [Matthew 28:19-20](#)

In the Great Commission, Jesus gives His followers a directive that transcends time and cultural boundaries: to go and make disciples. This command is foundational to our faith and challenges us to consider our role in the larger narrative of God's work in the world. It's not merely about sharing information; it's about embodying the message of hope and salvation so that others can experience the transformative power of the Gospel. This commission requires us to move beyond passive belief into active participation in God's mission.

As you reflect on this passage, think about what it looks like to live out the Great Commission in your daily life. It's about more than evangelism; it's about cultivating relationships, fostering community, and modeling discipleship in action. Are you ready to accept this call and take intentional steps towards making disciples, beginning in your own home and extending into your community?

- Who are some people in your life that you can disciple?
- What barriers do you face in sharing the Gospel?
- How can your local church support you in this commission?
- Pray for courage to act on the call to make disciples.
- Seek God's guidance on building relationships that reflect His love.

## Day 3

### [Hebrews 10:24-25](#)

The writer of Hebrews emphasizes the importance of community in our spiritual journey. Our faith is not meant to be lived in isolation; rather, we are called to encourage one another and spur each other on toward love and good deeds. In an age where individualism often reigns, it is essential to remember the value of fellowship and support in our walk with Christ. The church is designed to be a space where we can grow together, face challenges, and celebrate victories as a cohesive body.

Consider how you are engaging with your church community. Are you attending gatherings, participating in small groups, and fostering relationships with fellow believers? Your presence and contributions matter, and they can profoundly impact others. Reflect on how you can actively engage in your community and help build each other up as we collectively pursue God's calling.

- How do you currently engage with your church community?
- What are some ways you can encourage others in their faith?
- Are there any barriers preventing you from being more involved?
- Pray for deeper connections within your church.
- Ask God to show you individuals you can encourage this week.

## Day 4

### [John 15:5](#)

In John 15, Jesus beautifully illustrates our dependence on Him as the vine, and we are the branches. This imagery encapsulates the essence of our relationship with Christ—without Him, we can do nothing. As we embrace our identity as branches connected to the vine, we need to reflect on what it means to abide in Him daily. Abiding is more than merely existing; it's a conscious choice to dwell in His presence, allowing His life to flow through us and produce fruits that reflect His goodness and love.

As we strive to live out the Gospel, it is essential to remain rooted in Christ. Are you prioritizing time spent with Him in prayer and Scripture? Your spiritual vitality is nourished through this connection, and it's what empowers you to carry out His work in the world. Consider ways to deepen your relationship with Christ and how that will influence your actions toward others.

- In what ways do you find it challenging to abide in Christ?
- What practices can you implement to strengthen your connection with Him?
- How does knowing you are connected to the vine change your perspective on your faith?
- Pray for a deeper relationship with Christ.
- Seek guidance on how to better abide in Him daily.

## Day 5

### [Acts 1:8](#)

The final words of Jesus before His ascension serve as a powerful reminder of our mission: to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth. As believers, we are tasked with spreading the message of His love and truth far and wide. This call is both exhilarating and challenging, requiring us to step out of our comfort zones and actively seek opportunities to share our faith. Are we willing to embrace this mission and faithfully represent Christ in our neighborhoods, workplaces, and beyond?

As we conclude this devotional, reflect on how you can be a witness in your daily life. This could take many forms, from simple acts of kindness to more explicit conversations about your faith. The world is watching, and your actions can inspire others to explore their own relationship with God. Consider making a list of practical ways you can be a witness and ask for God's help in carrying out His mission.

- How can you be a witness for Christ in your everyday life?

- Who in your life needs to hear about Jesus?
- Pray for opportunities to share your faith this week.
- Ask God for boldness and wisdom as you witness to others.
