"Hey everyone, welcome to *ALL IN NIGHT 1*! I'm _____, and I get to serve here as [your role]. I'm so glad you're here!

For the next five weeks, we're diving into the story of *Nehemiah* – a story about rebuilding, renewal, and the kind of faith that moves from comfort to calling.

Our hope? That every one of us learns what it means to go ALL IN with God, together."

ON-CAMPUS HOST SCRIPT

SLIDE 3: Icebreaker Instructions

THE NAME GAME

The first person shares their name by adding an adjective that starts with the same letter (i.e. "Funny Fredy").

The next person repeats all the names and adds their own. Only ONE "pass" per person!



HOST: "Alright, let's start with something fun to help us learn each other's names! We're going to play *The Name Game*.

Here's how it works:

The first person says an adjective that starts with the same letter as their first name – like 'Clever Claire', 'Funny Fredy', or 'Kind Karen.'

The next person repeats all the names before them and adds their own.

You get **one pass** (or two if your group has eight or more people).

Let's see which table can remember the whole list! Ready? Go!"

"Nice job! Some of you are way too good at that. Now that we've laughed a little, let's lean into why we're here."

ON-CAMPUS HOST SCRIPT

**PICK A TABLE HOST IF THERE ISN'T ONE ESTABLISHED**

Now that you've interacted with your table, we're going to do a fun little exercise. At the count of 3, everyone point to the person at your table that you think would be a good facilitator of discussion. Ready...1...2...3!

Those of you with all the fingers pointing your way, you're not at all surprised, are you? :) So you'll have a very important task tonight, which will be facilitating the discussion questions after we watch this video".

HOST: "Tonight, we're starting where every move of God begins – with a heart that breaks for something that matters to God.

Pastor Gene is going to take us through *Nehemiah 1* and show us how heartbreak can be the spark God uses to rebuild what's broken."

**SLIDE 5: Transition Slide****7:00 – 7:45 | Table Discussion**

“Alright friends, let’s move into discussion time. Remember – this isn’t a Bible class with teachers and students. It’s a conversation around the table where we listen, share, and learn from each other.

If you don’t have the guide book, don’t worry, everything you need for the discussion will be up on the screen.”

SLIDE 6 – House Rules

ON-CAMPUS HOST SCRIPT



- *There are no teachers at any table*
- *Allow opportunity for everyone to share if they'd like to.*
- *What's shared in our group stays in our group.*

**HOUSE RULES**

A few reminders:

- There are no teachers at your table – everyone has something to bring.
- Keep your answers around 1 minute so everyone gets a turn to share.
- What's shared at the table stays at the table. Let's create safe space for honesty."

SLIDE 7-11 – Discussion Questions

Allow about 6-8 minutes per question.

Call out halfway and one-minute warnings to keep tables on pace.

HOST:

[HOST, read each question on the mic, and allow approximately 6-8 minutes for each question. Let the room know when you're about halfway through the slide time, and when they have one minute. Then, change the slide and read the next question, and so on.]

“Let’s wrap up tonight in prayer. You don’t have to pray out loud if you’re not comfortable. Just listen and agree in your heart.

Here are a few prompts to guide you:

- Pray for the things that break God’s heart in your world.
- Pray for the courage to ask the right questions like Nehemiah did.
- Pray for our church as we go ALL IN together.

Take a moment to share requests around your table and then pray together.
I’ll call us back in about 5 minutes.”

HOST:

“Before we close, I want to invite you into something really special we’re doing together as a church family – *Public Reading of Scripture*.

Every Thursday, people from **all of our campuses** gather online to listen to God’s Word together. It’s simple. It’s powerful. And it helps us stay grounded in what truly transforms us – Scripture itself.

ON-CAMPUS HOST SCRIPT
